

Assistant Professor of Biology Education

Responsibilities:

Primary responsibilities include coordinating the bachelor of secondary education program in biology and managing introductory biology laboratories. The successful candidate will teach a course in biology teaching methods, coordinate the introductory biology laboratories, and be responsible for training and supervising departmental GTAs. Additional teaching may include sections of introductory biology lecture, laboratory, and/or upper level courses in the candidate's field. The successful candidate will be expected to develop an active research program, including the supervision of graduate (M.S.) and undergraduate research, and they will be encouraged to apply for extramural funding.

Qualifications:

Minimum qualifications include a doctoral degree and relevant research experience. Teaching experience at the K-12 level is desirable. We are especially interested in candidates with broad training in biology as well as expertise in the scholarship of teaching and learning.
