Join innovative faculty in the **Department of Teacher Development and Educational Studies at Oakland University**. We invite applications for a tenure-track position at the assistant professor rank in the area of Elementary Mathematics Education. We seek an individual with a strong background in elementary mathematics teacher education. Applicants who have engaged in and apply equitable teaching practices, have an interest in practice-based teacher preparation, clinical experience, school-university partnerships, curriculum design and assessment practices, and teaching quality, are particularly encouraged to apply. We value candidates who can work collaboratively across departments and institutional boundaries and participate in sustained engagement with local schools and organizations.

Position: Assistant Professor of Elementary Mathematics Education

Job Description Summary:

We seek to hire an **assistant professor** with expertise in elementary mathematics education and teacher education. We are interested in a faculty member whose teaching practice is undergirded by contemporary research within mathematics and elementary teacher education; whose work demonstrates a strong commitment to equitable teaching practices, social justice and diversity; who has an interest in and/or experience with practice-based teacher education; and who is eager to work collaboratively within the department, across departments, and within our university-school partnerships.

Responsibilities: teach undergraduate and graduate courses related to elementary mathematics teaching; develop new courses to advance program delivery; advise graduate students; maintain active research and publication agendas; and collaborate to write grants and shape innovative programs.

Minimum Qualifications

Candidates are expected to have: 1) an earned doctorate or ABD (with completion by August 2019) in teacher education or a related field, with scholarly expertise in mathematics education; 2) successful mathematics teaching experience in grades K-8; and 3) a potential for accomplishment in scholarship.

Special Instructions to Applicants

Appointment begins August 2019. The salary for this position is dependent upon qualifications and is accompanied by a substantial benefits package.

Candidates should upload a cover letter describing teaching experience, and research interest; a Diversity Statement; CV; a writing sample; unofficial transcripts; and contact information of three references to complete the application. Your Diversity Statement should describe your interest or efforts in furthering diversity and inclusion, e.g., through mentoring, pedagogy, activism, faculty recruitment/retention, or research on issues related to diversity and social inequality.
