Job Summary/Objective:

Sweet Briar College invites applications for a full time position in the Teacher Education Program at the Assistant Professor level. The candidate will be considered a generalist in the area of curriculum and instruction, with a specialized focus on reading and literacy. Candidates must be committed to teaching excellence in a liberal arts community while maintaining an active program of scholarly research. Teaching assignments are 3:3 at the undergraduate and graduate level, and preference will go to candidates who are able to model differentiated curriculum and instruction. The faculty member is also responsible for supervising clinical and student teaching experiences and advising undergraduate students.

Sweet Briar's Teacher Education Program (<http://www.sbc.edu/education>) prepares licensure candidates to teach through integrated clinical and professional development courses. Elementary candidates may earn a B.A. and licensure in four years and elementary, secondary, and PreK-12 candidates can earn licensure in a five-year program leading to the Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT). The focus is differentiated curriculum, instruction, and assessment. Candidates ready to work with a diverse student body are especially welcome. Sweet Briar prides itself on creating a learning environment that encourages young women to fulfill their highest potential. Leadership in all walks of life is fostered by the special connections our faculty make with their students, and Sweet Briar women translate their academic experiences into interesting and important lives.

Required Qualifications:

- The successful applicant will hold a Ph.D. or Ed.D. Candidates completing their terminal degrees will also be considered;
- Possess at least three years of K-12 teaching experience; and
- Must be a superlative teacher.
