

The Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education at the University of Oklahoma-Norman Campus is seeking an **Assistant or Associate Professor (tenure-track) in Learning Technologies**. We invite individuals who will promote digital literacies in critical and constructive ways with teachers, students, and communities. We are seeking creative, innovative, justice-oriented individuals with practical and scholarly experience to be part of a robust program and academic community. We welcome individuals who are prepared to take a leading role in developing, teaching, and providing vision (and mentorship) for learning technologies courses for teacher preparation programs, including an undergraduate course for all teacher candidates (PK-12). We seek candidates who are committed to building a research agenda that engages in transformational capacities of education in culturally responsive and sustaining technology pedagogy and/or technology for equity and social justice. Successful candidates will make clear how, through their research and teaching, they will promote equitable, inclusive, and justice-oriented learning environments on campus and in surrounding communities.

The responsibilities of the position consist of but are not limited to: leading role in vision and mentorship for learning technologies for teacher preparation programs; developing or continuing a productive research agenda in education; seeking external funding to support research, teaching, and service activities; teaching courses in learning technologies and other related undergraduate and graduate level courses in your area of expertise each regular semester with opportunities to teach during the summer months; directing master's theses and doctoral dissertations; providing service to the department, college, university, and profession; continuing current relationships with centers and other colleges and departments across the university; developing relationships with formal and informal learning communities throughout the state of Oklahoma; and participating in other activities as appropriate.

Rank and Area of Specialization: Assistant or Associate Professor (tenure-track) in Learning Technologies

Required Qualifications:

- Earned doctorate with a focus on educational/learning technologies in Curriculum and Instruction, Learning Sciences, Educational Psychology, Educational Foundations, Special Education, Teaching and Learning, or a closely related field from an accredited university;
- At least three years' experience of teaching in public and/or private schools in grades PK-12;
- Experience teaching courses in educational technology at the undergraduate and/or graduate levels;
- Demonstrated ability to conduct research and make scholarly contributions to a field of education through curriculum and/or professional development, research, publications, and presentations at national and international meetings.

Desired Qualifications:

- Strong academic background in educational technology;
- Demonstrated commitment to working towards equity and justice in education;
- Expertise in relevant theories, technologies, and research methods;
- Prepared to teach existing course offerings in the college and develop courses;

- Research experience in educational technology and/or related areas;
- Familiarity with current teacher accountability requirements OR demonstrated commitment to undergraduate teacher preparation;
- Demonstrated ability or capacity to obtain external funding;
- Experience in advising and/or mentoring undergraduate and/or graduate students in teacher preparation and technology education research;
- Eligible for state licensure in education;
- Evidence of and potential for collaboration to sustain and expand existing partnerships, and experience providing professional services/supports to students, teachers, schools, or communities.

We seek candidates who will provide inspiration and leadership in research and actively contribute to effective teaching. We are especially interested in candidates who can contribute, through their teaching, research, and service, to the diversity and excellence of the academic community and who will build collaborative ties within and beyond the home department, in the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education, and the University of Oklahoma.

- combined teaching and research statements (no more than 2 pages),

- unofficial graduate transcripts (must have official transcripts if invited to interview), and
- up to three samples of professional writings.

Candidates invited for a campus interview will be expected to interact with current graduate and undergraduate students and make a presentation on their research agenda.

Review of completed applications will begin on November 15, 2021 and continue until the position is filled. Starting date is August 15, 2022.
