Students in Teacher Education SIG

The purpose of the **Students in Teacher Education SIG** is to encourage the active participation of teacher education students in ATE. The primary mechanism for accomplishing this is through student presentations at the SIG meeting at the national conference.

The ATE conference theme for 2020 is ***Advocating for Teacher Education: Impacting Research, Policy, and Practice***. There are no restrictions on focus/theme for the SIG session. The focus of the presentation could be sharing research findings, describing an on-going project, best practices in teacher education, or new ideas that you are exploring with your colleagues and students. Proposals should be submitted in one of the following formats:

A. Roundtable/Poster: Roundtables/Posters are informal sessions during which a presenter is seated at a table/poster to discuss works-in-progress that may not be ready for formal presentation. Tables are numbered to allow conference attendees to easily identify an individual presenter's session. Each discussion lasts 40 minutes.

C. Brief Research: This session provides an opportunity for authors to present a synopsis of their work. Each paper will be given approximately 15 minutes to present, followed by a 15-minute question-and-answer session.

The proposal for the presentation should include: (1) *Title of Presentation*; (2) *Type of Format*; (3) *Brief Description of Content (no more than 50 words to be listed in the conference program)*; (4) *Abstract of Presentation (300-500 words)*; and (5) *Names, Titles and Positions of All Presenters*; and (6) *Descriptions of the Audience*. The deadline for receipt of Student in Teacher Education proposals is **Tuesday, September 24, 2019**. Please submit your proposal to Dr. Giang-Nguyen Nguyen via email gnguyen@uwf.edu.

We would like to host a few presentations at the SIG session as well as conduct a brief "organization" discussion. In order to have presenters listed in the program, it is imperative that proposals are submitted in a timely manner that meets the deadline. All proposals will be reviewed by a select committee. The committee will give all proposals careful consideration and select promptly so that you may plan your professional development early for the 2019-2020 academic year.
